

>>> FIRST MEETING OF OLI4FOOD PROJECT PARTNERS HELD IN ISTAMBUL (TURKEY)

The first meeting between the OLI4FOOD project partners has been held during the 26th and 27th of November 2024 at the facilities of Istambul Technical University (ITU). This meeting marked an important starting point to coordinate the project activities and strategies focused on producing, on an industrial scale and based on the use of selected microbial pools, functional olive-based products in order to promote access to safe and affordable products, valorising the concept of a healthy Mediterranean diet taking into account the identity and diversity of cultures and food systems in the different regions of the Mediterranean area.
